

Education and wellbeing recovery timeline

- **November 2020**, holiday, activities and food (HAF) programme extended to the Christmas, Easter and summer holidays
- **January 2021 – March 2021**, partial school closures
- **February**, Sir Kevan Collins announced as Education Recovery Commissioner
- **February**, £700 million announced for summer schools, Recovery Premium and National Tutoring Programme expansion
- **March**, summer school funding allocations for 2-week schemes (for mainstream pupils) with suggestion of targeting year 7 pupils
- **March - May**, ADCS engagement with education recovery planning via meetings with Sir Kevan Collins and Sir Alan Wood
- **May**, Sir Kevan Collins reportedly recommends Government commits £15 billion over three years
- **June**, Sir Kevan Collins resigns as Education Recovery Commissioner following announcement of only £1.4 billion for education recovery with a focus on tutoring
- **July**, Ofsted updates its Education Inspection Handbook for September 2021 to include:

“Where the school is directly deploying tutors to support education recovery from the pandemic, inspectors will consider how their deployment supports the aims of the school curriculum. Use of tutors will be integrated into the evaluation of quality of education and leadership and management and will not be inspected in its own right.”
