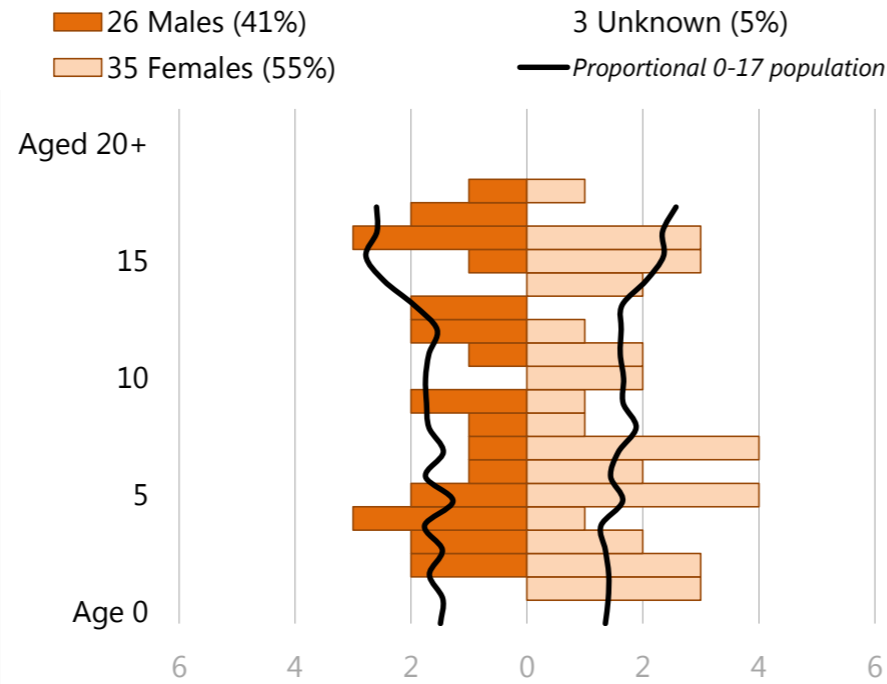

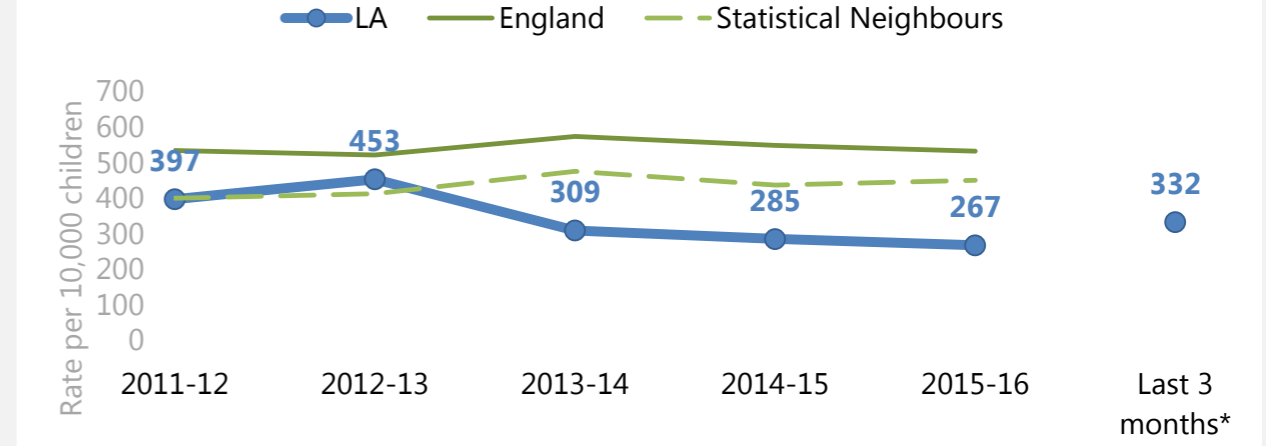
#### Source of referral

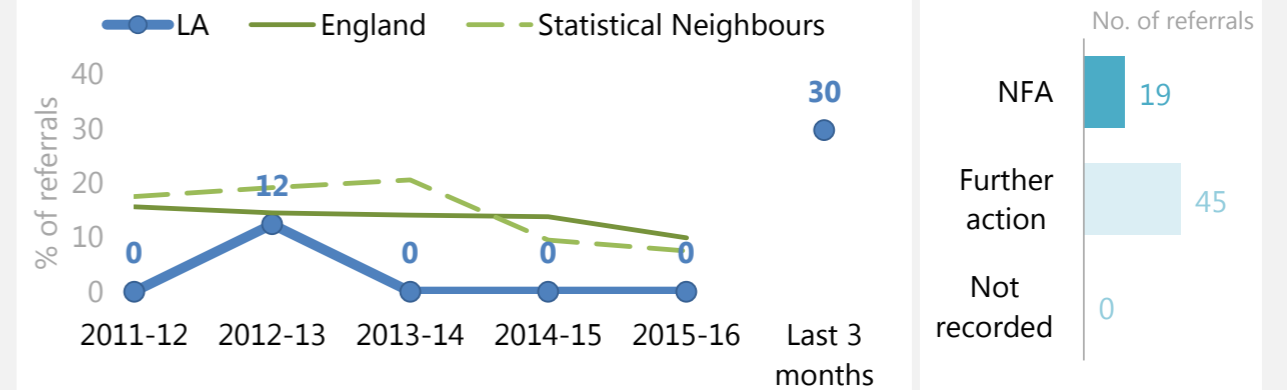


#### Rate of referrals per 10,000 children aged 0-17

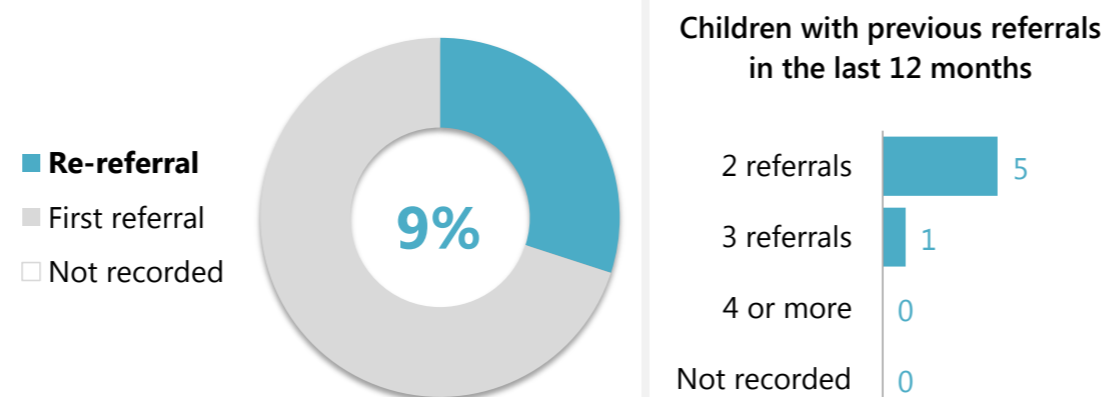

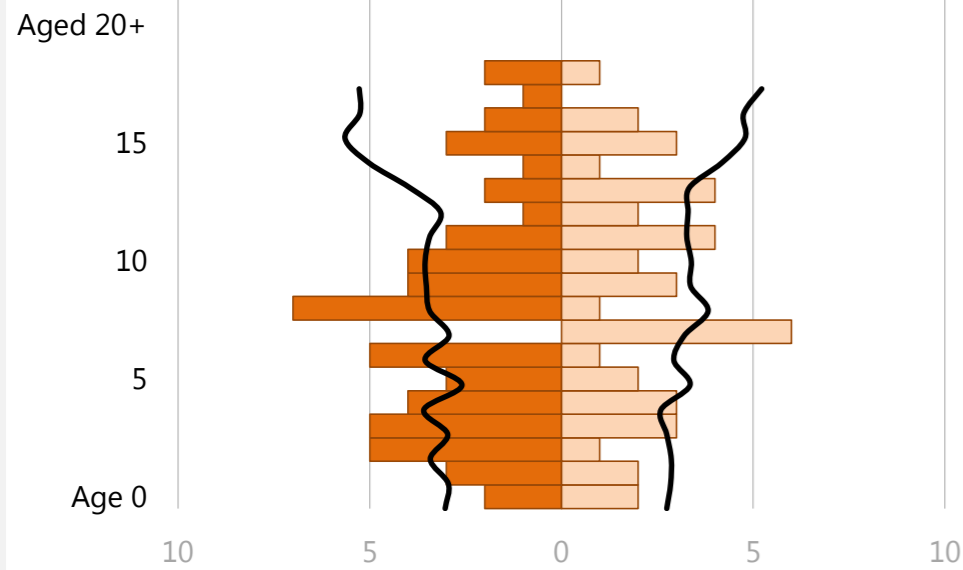

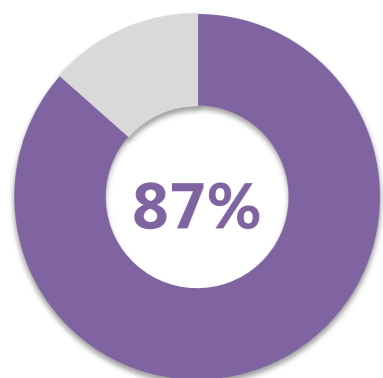


### Duration of each completed and ongoing assessment

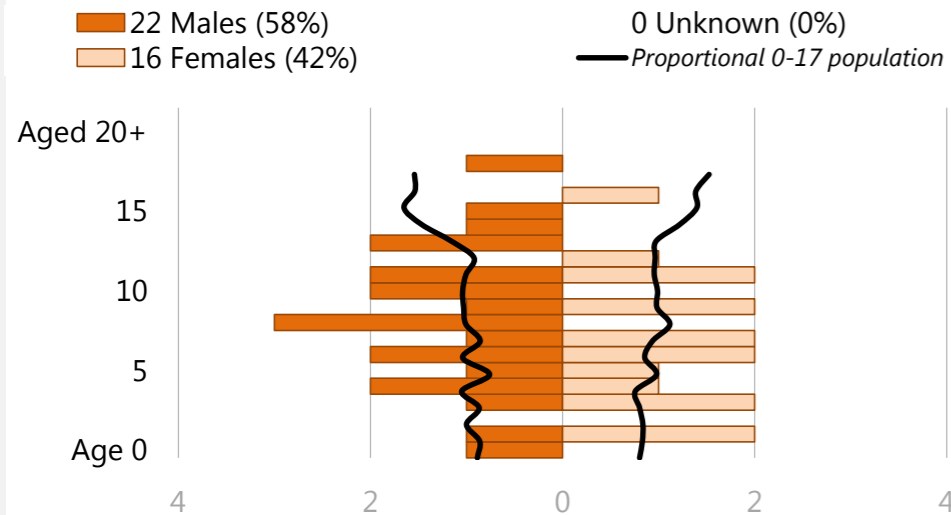

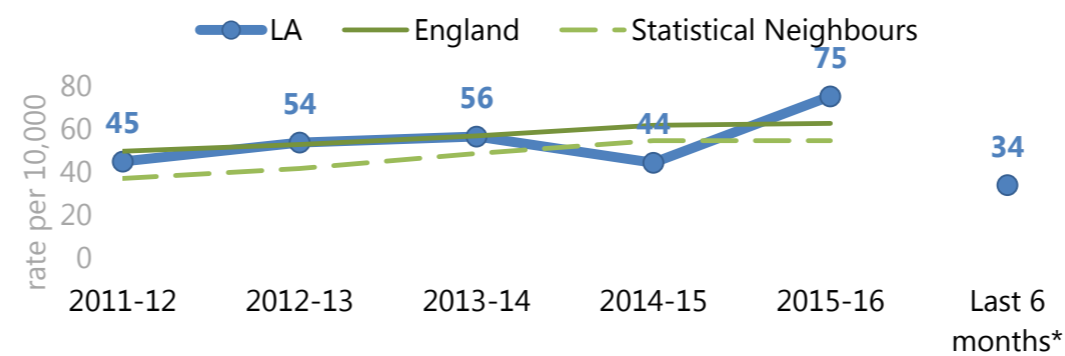

### Rate of ICPCs per 10,000 children aged 0-17



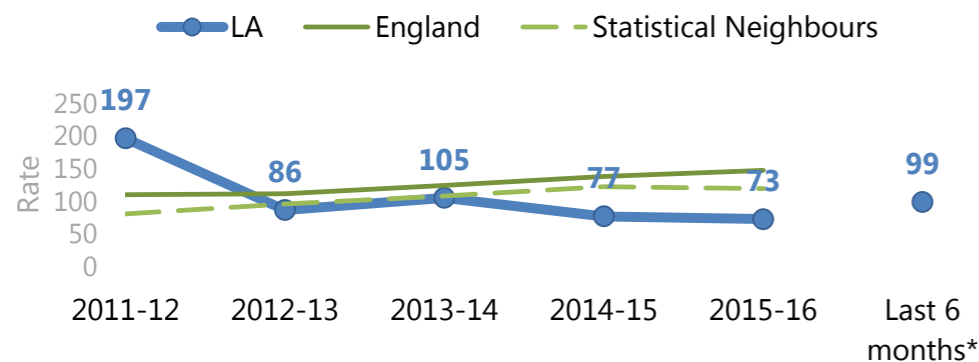

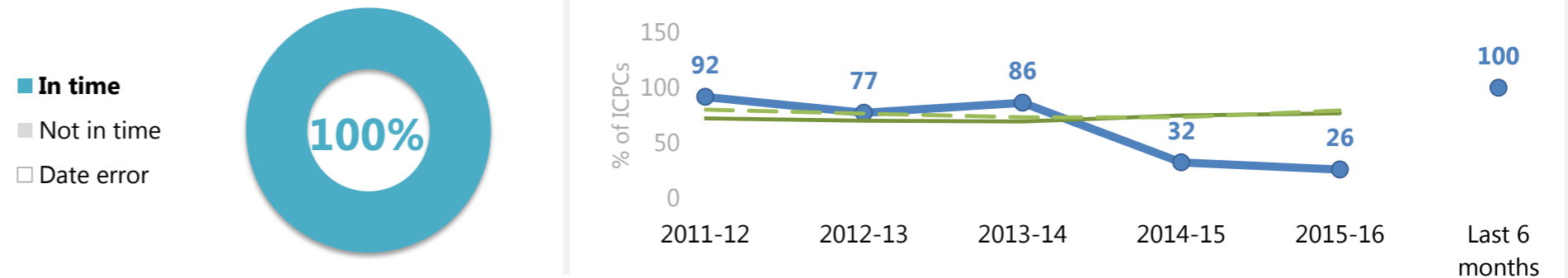

### Rate of S47 enquiries per 10,000 children aged 0-17

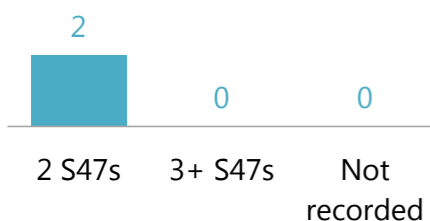

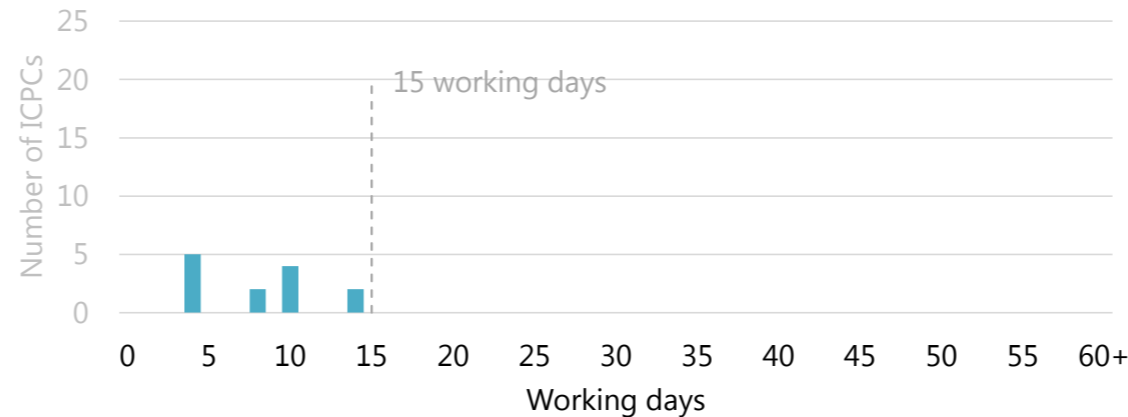

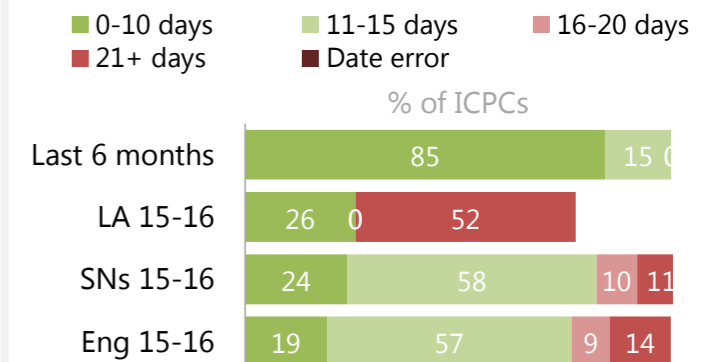

### Duration between S47 start date and ICPC date



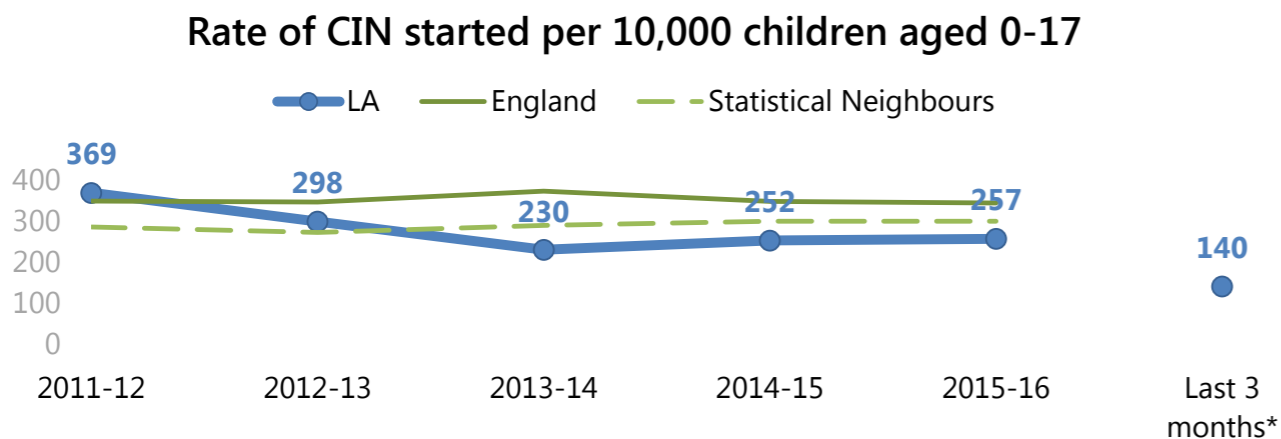
### Comparing ICPC timeliness

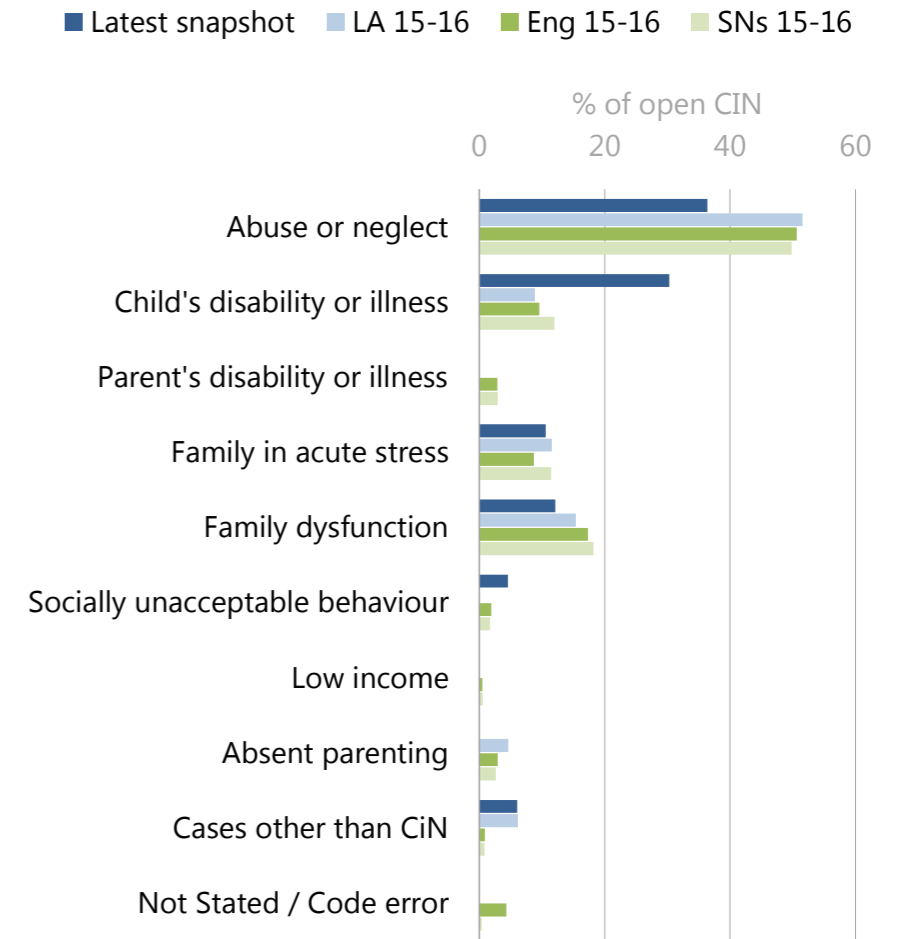

#### Rate of open CIN per 10,000 children aged 0-17

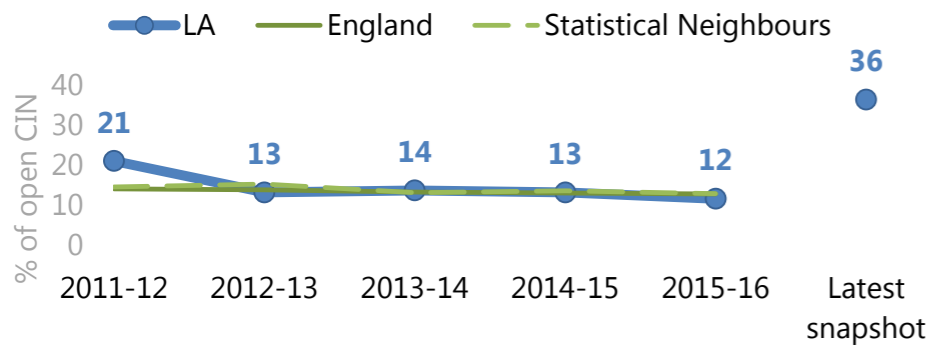

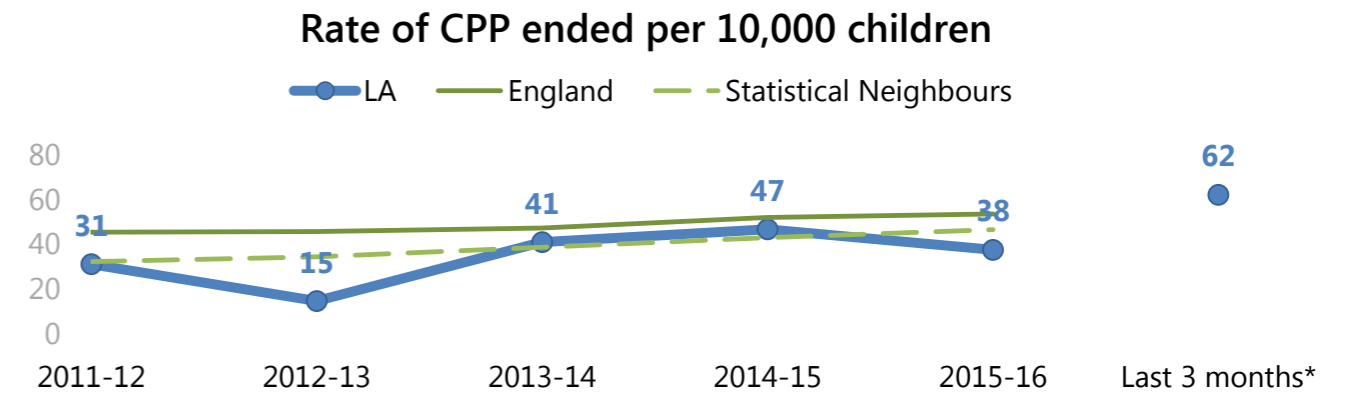

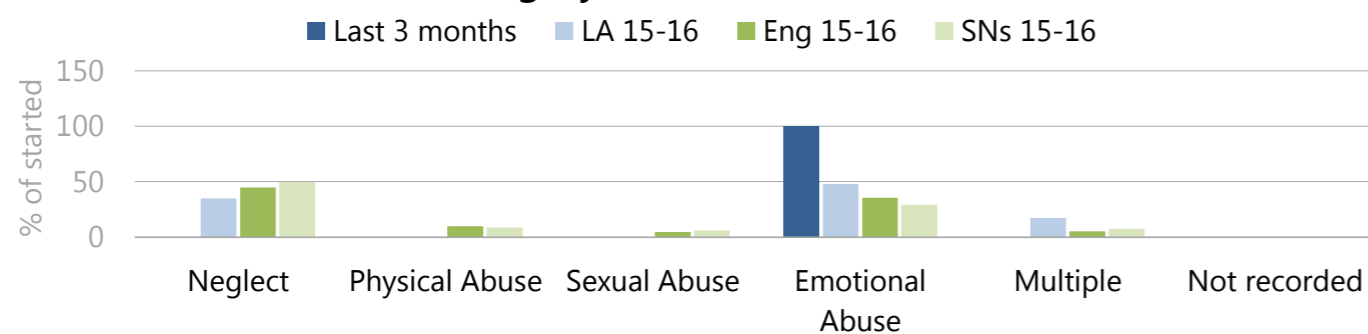
### Re-registrations for children who started on a CP plan (ever)



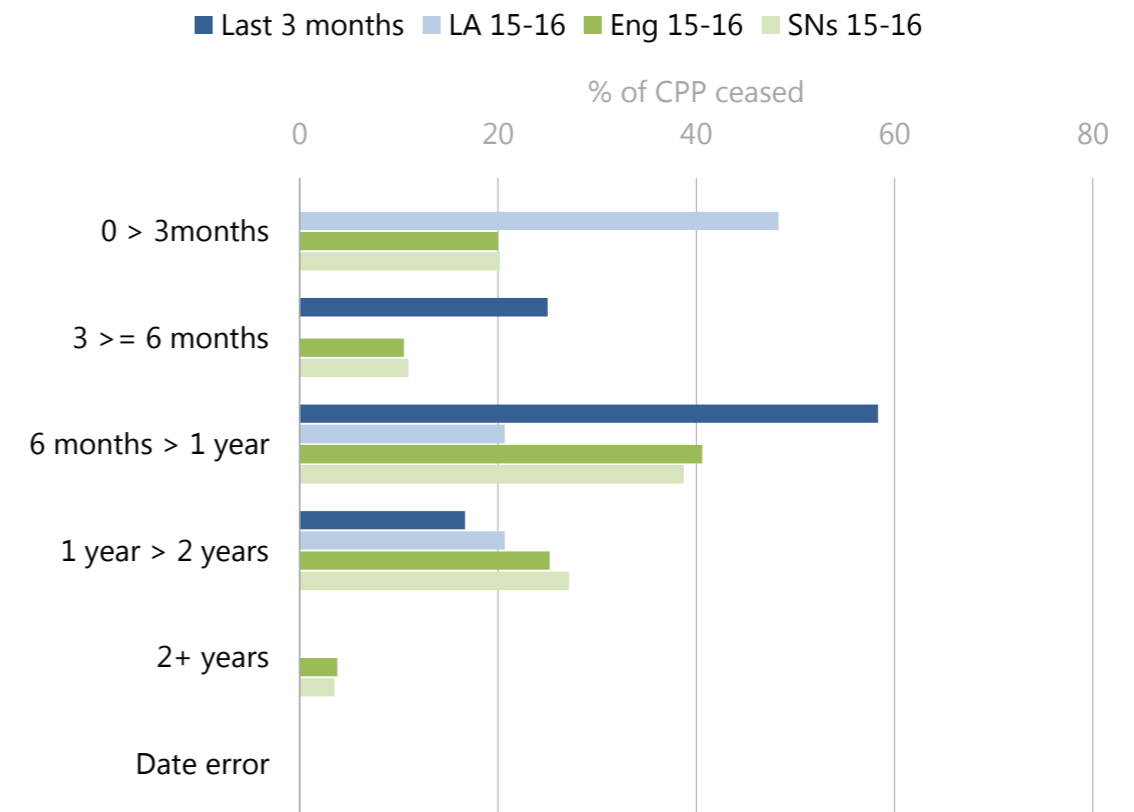
### Comparing re-registrations for CPP started

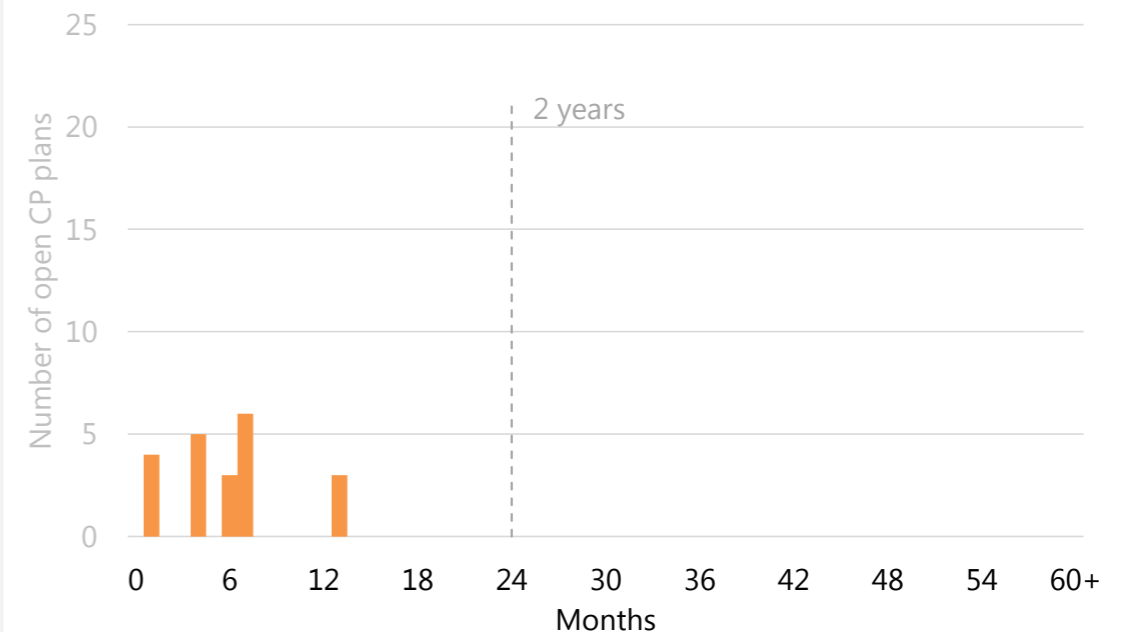
#### Latest category of abuse for current CP plans (%)

### CLA placements by type and provision



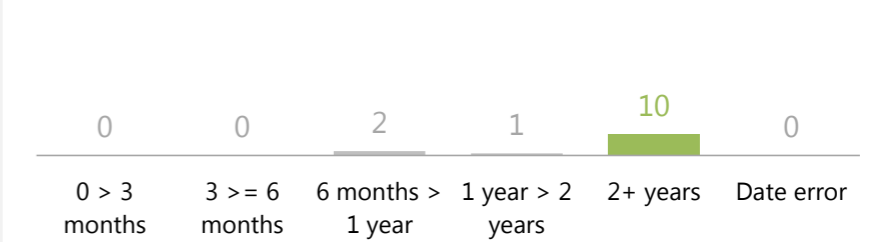

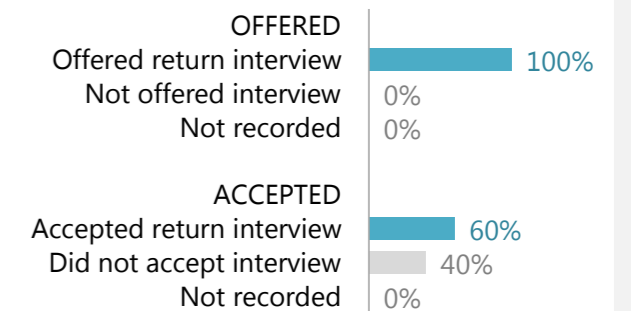
### Placements out of borough and over 20 miles from home

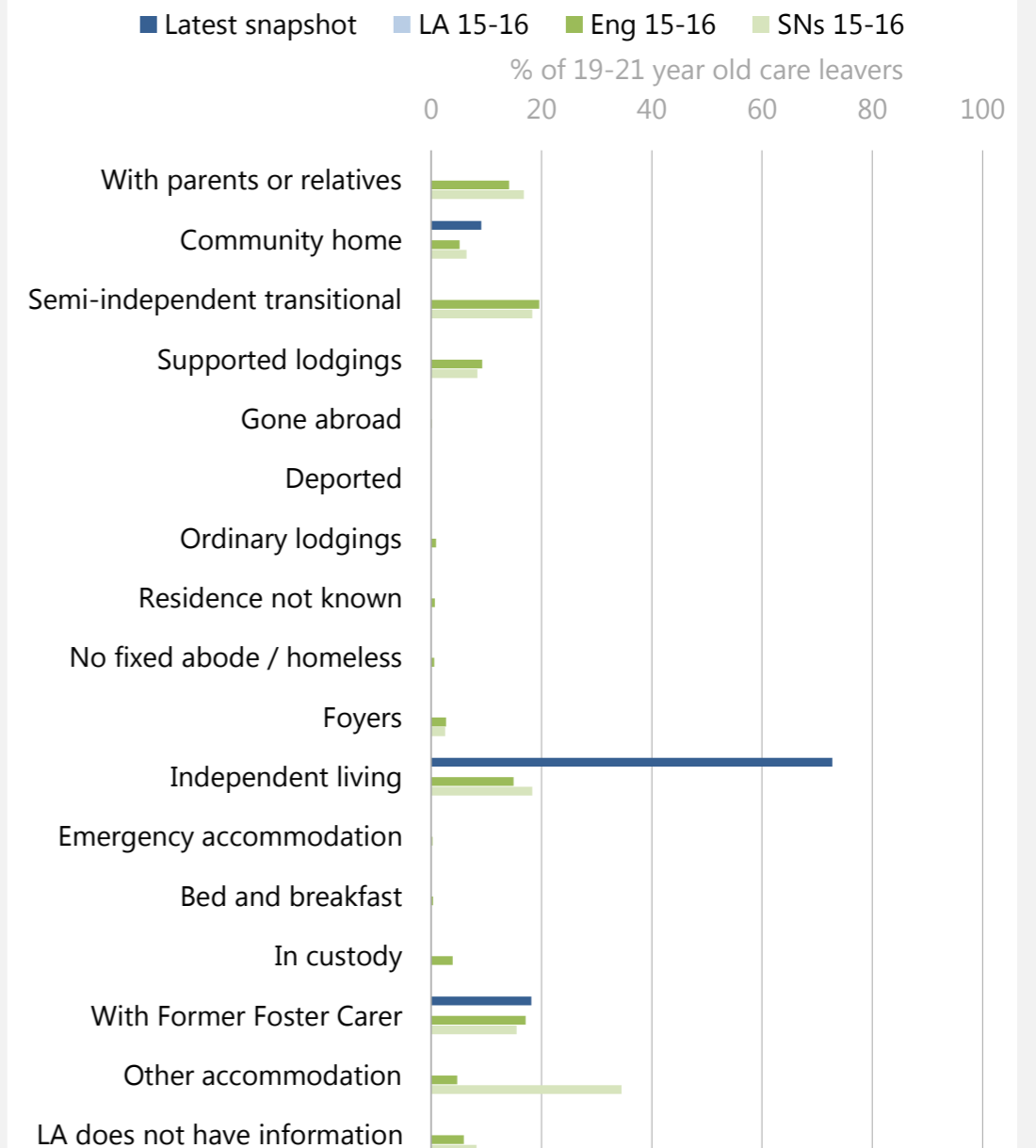

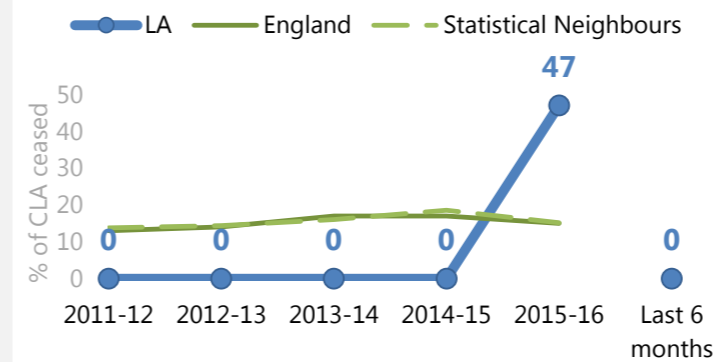

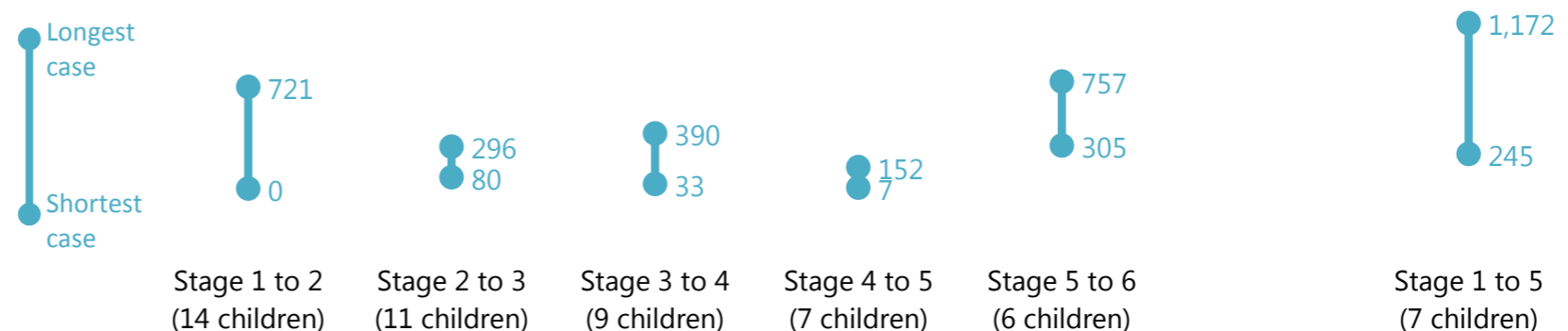

### Average duration of each stage (number of days)



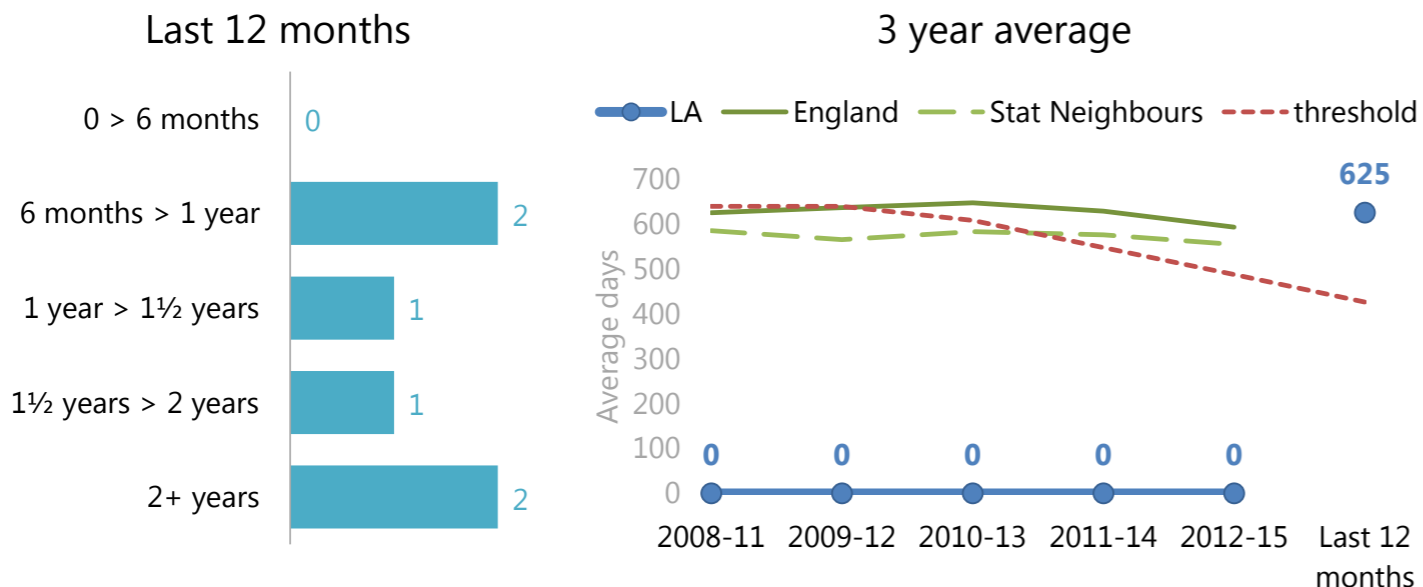
### Range in days between shortest and longest cases at each stage

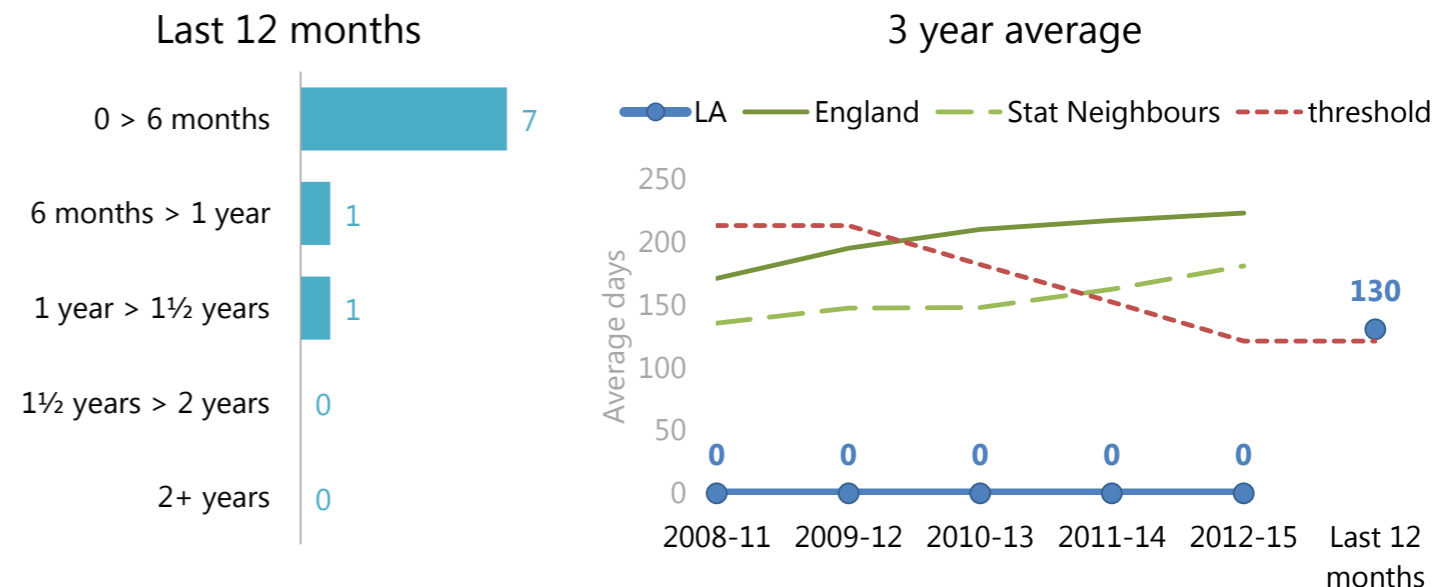

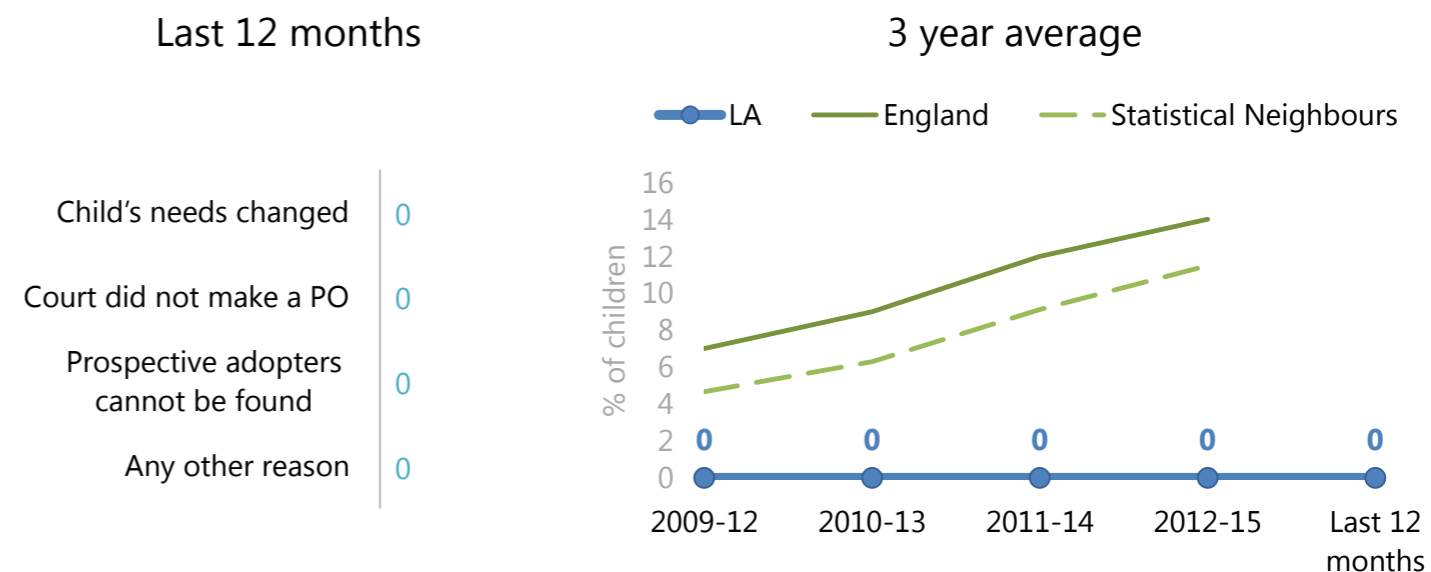

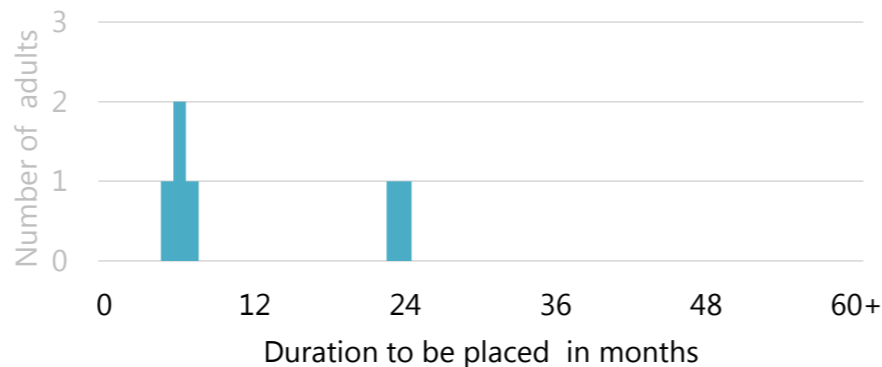

Percentage of adoptive families matched to a child who waited more than three months between approval and matching



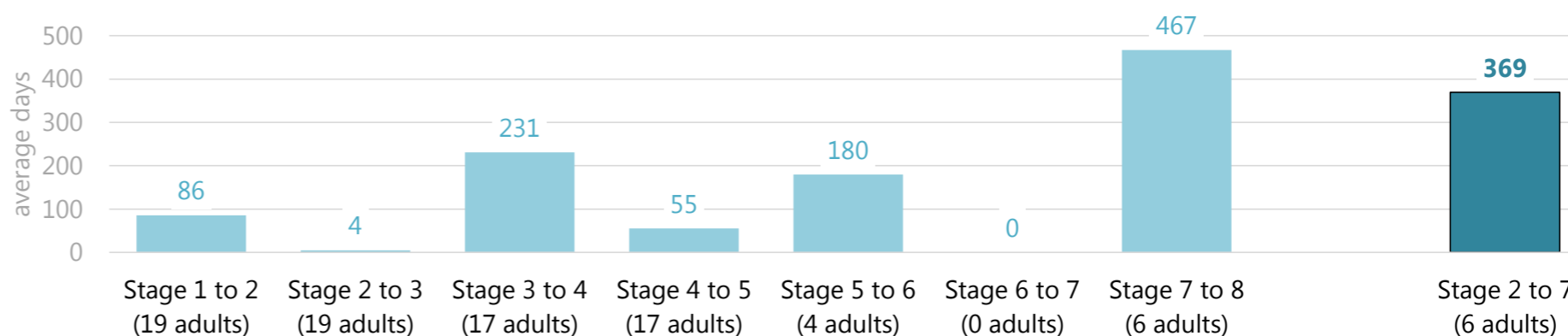

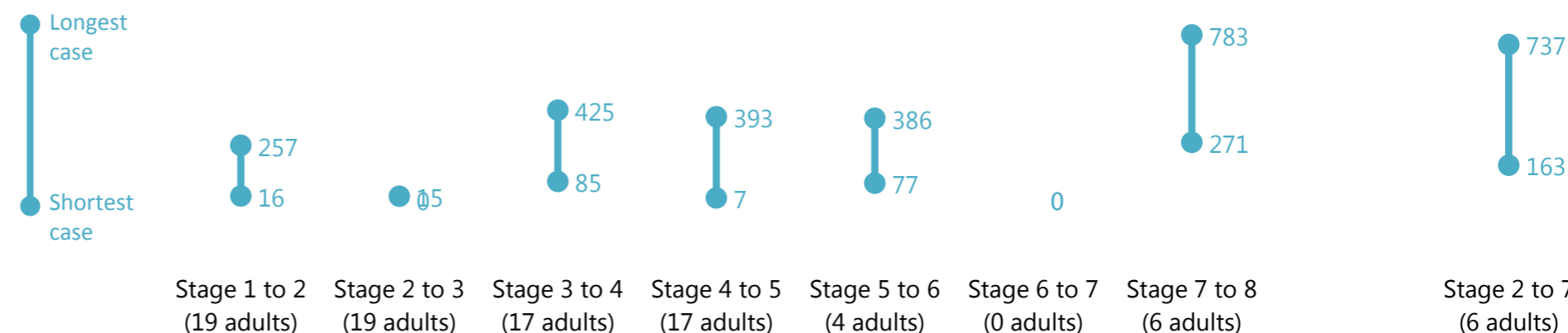
